MEN'S MINISTRIES BREAKFAST

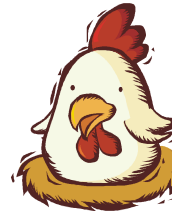

Pastor's Corner

RETURN, REVIVE, RENEW

This Sunday is a great time to **return, revive, and renew**. This is the perfect time to indicate our openness to all that God has in mind for us. Luke was for it!

Shortly after the Day of Pentecost the church was engaged in ministering to the needs of the body as well as proclaiming the Good News that Jesus is the messiah. Remarkably, the OPPOSITION grew and persecution was boiling just beneath the surface about to be unleashed upon the believers. The church's response was to COME TOGETHER and SEEK THE LORD for boldness to stand fast. That place was shaken and they were **filled AGAIN with the Holy Spirit!**

Second, events of revival seem to be necessary when there has been a great cooling or indifference to the things of God. Revival events seem as necessary as **an alarm clock to stir the slumbering Christians**. Don't touch the SNOOZE! **Renewal is needed!**

Finally, our day-to-day negotiation through life's challenges requires a source of strength and a constant refurbishing of spiritual intensity. We are in **constant need of the reviving work of the Holy Spirit**. He acts to bring life afresh and anew to the situation. Like a fresh wind He blows upon us and refreshes our spirit.
